

## 2016 CRISP Competition Information and Application Outcomes

WCHRI is pleased to announce the awardees of the newly launched Clinical/Community Research Integration Support Program (CRISP). This opportunity is intended to foster clinical, community and/or educational research relevant to the Stollery Children's Hospital (STO) and/or Lois Hole Hospital for Women (LHHW) and to facilitate the development of a research integrated hospital environment that is responsive to the needs of the community. Funding requests are for up to \$20,000 spent over a period of two years.

### Application Outcomes

The CRISP application process includes both a Letter of Intent (LOI) and Full Application for approved LOI submissions. A total of 19 LOIs from diverse faculties and departments were received; of these 13 were invited to full application; 10 final applications were peer-reviewed by the Clinical/Community Research Integration Support Program (CRISP) Review Committee, chaired by Dr. Lonnie Zwaigenbaum.
